Thank you for your application for a Certificate of Exemption for works to the above place. Your application has been approved by the Heritage Council under section 42(3) (a) of the *Historic Cultural Heritage Act 1995* for the following works:

Works: Adaptive re-use of the church for sales of wine and farm produce. Works include an accessible footpath; an on-site wastewater treatment system; plumbing, drainage and electrical services; dismantling of a number of pews and re-use in new joinery items (to be reversible).
