"I am delighted to announce the appointment of Greg Tory as our new Chief Executive Officer (CEO). Greg will officially commence in early September and has been appointed on a four-year performance-based contract.

He was interviewed on two occasions by the CEO Recruitment Panel comprising a group of four Councillors who were delegated by the full Councillor group to complete this important task on their behalf.
