#### 1. From the Curator

The East Coast Heritage Museum (henceforth referred to as 'the Museum'), based in Swansea, is a significant community facility within the Glamorgan Spring Bay municipality. It commemorates the history of the area and the involvement of local people in Australia's military conflicts. It is the Museum's function to maintain its collection for the Glamorgan Spring Bay Community and to make visitors aware of the unique heritage of the area through interpretive exhibitions and an exchange of information – 'Preserving the past for the future'.

This document has been prepared for the Glamorgan Spring Bay Council to report on and highlight activities and events that have occurred at the Museum during the period July 2017 – June 2018.

Two Aboriginal maireener shell necklaces from a local source were advertised on 'Gumtree'. The Curator visited Carolyn Audet at Lisdillon and purchased the two necklaces from her. Both have significance to local Aboriginal people and to the Richardson family

In December 2017 the Museum launched the Glamorgan Spring Bay Historical Society's book *Houses and Estates of Old Glamorgan*. A small photographic exhibition with accompanying related artefacts (sourced from the collection) was launched at the same time. It was a very successful event with over 50 attendees.

Tasmanian Museum and Art Gallery (TMAG) Art Curators, Jane Stewart and Peter Hughes, visited the Museum to inspect the Violet Mace Pottery Collection and the Bock portraits. They were surprised and impressed by the Museum's collection of Mace pottery and the two significant sketches by the colonial artist Thomas Bock.

Glenda King, author of the book *Maude Poynter – Painter and Potter*, contacted the Curator to research the Museum's Violet Mace Pottery Collection. Poynter and Mace were cousins through the Meredith line and for a time Violet lived and worked in their joint studio at 'Ratho' near Bothwell. In November 2017 the Curator was invited and attended the launch of Glenda King's book at Narryna in Battery Point.

The Museum holds a Limerick lace veil worn at the weddings of both Louisa Anne Twamley (Mrs Charles Meredith) and her mother Louisa Anne Meredith (Mrs Thomas Twamley). TMAG recently contacted the Curator to discuss the possibility of borrowing this significant item for a future exhibition in Hobart.

New volunteer Luana Nandan joined the Museum in late 2017. Luana previously worked in the 'Special and Rare Collection' located in the University of Tasmania Library, and brings a wealth of professional expertise and historical knowledge into the Museum.

December 2017 was when the Museum's volunteer photographer Russell Abbott retired. Russell was with us for over a year and photographed circa 60% of the collection, including a large proportion of the archival collection. Subsequently, Ruth Frost joined the Museum's volunteer team in 2018. Ruth was a teacher of photography at the University of Tasmania and will be an invaluable member of the team.

Early 2018 an archaeological team from the Australian National University returned to Triabunna and continued their 'Barracks' project. The Curator assisted the team to clean and identify artefacts.

Helen Whitty, a Museum Consultant for Museums Australia and previously at the Powerhouse Museum in Sydney, selected the East Coast Heritage Museum as a case study, since published on her website at: <a href="https://pt.slideshare.net/HelenWhitty/east-coast-heritage-museum">https://pt.slideshare.net/HelenWhitty/east-coast-heritage-museum</a>

Arts Tasmania again requested an object from the Museum's collection for their 10 Objects 10 Stories exhibition held from March-May 2018 at TMAG. The Museum's important early Louisa Anne Meredith gown was selected. As part of the deal with Arts Tasmania, Judith Andrewartha, Consultant Conservator, stabilised and mounted the gown. The Curator attended the launch and made the social pages of the *Mercury*. As an additional bonus, the Museum's gown was featured on that evening's TV news. The Curator was one of four quest speakers invited to speak about their object on display.

Other workshops and events to which the Curator was invited include:

- Galleries, Libraries, Archives & Museums (GLAM) Peak two-day 'Digitising your Collection'
  workshop at TMAG, Hobart, November 2017. At this event the Curator gave a presentation on the
  Museum's digitisation activities.
- Woolmers Art Exhibition, Longford, February 2018.
- Female Convicts Research Centre Seminar (supported by the University of Tasmania), Hobart, April 2018.

On behalf of the Glamorgan Spring Bay Council the Curator organised an 'Au Revoir' to Bertrand Cadart in April 2018. This included providing invitations, catering and the venue, as well as researching and mounting a new exhibition. This was a very successful event with over 100 people attending.

The Governor the Hon. Kate Warner and her husband, Richard Warner, visited the Museum during May 2018. They were delighted with the exhibitions, work spaces and storage facilities. Afterwards the Curator was invited to attend a function for them at Craigie Knowe.

John Wadsley, Co-ordinator of the Maritime Museum, Hobart, invited the East Coast Heritage Museum to host the annual seminar of the Maritime Heritage Organisations of Tasmania (MHOOT) in Swansea in May 2018. Over 60 people attended this event at the Swansea Court House. Food was supplied by the Bark Mill and eight guest speakers from around the state enlightened the attendees.

Visits from Ross Latham, the Archivist of the Tasmanian Archive and Heritage Office (TAHO), and Senator Guy Barnett, during the past twelve months have seen the Museum receive favourable reports on the collections and specifically on the storage facilities and our scanning projects. During the year the Curator visited Hobart to scan historic 19<sup>th</sup> century Council minute books and other records relating to Glamorgan Spring Bay which are held by TAHO. These digital records are now available for researchers in Glamorgan Spring Bay.

David and Jennifer Lathwell donated three original framed images from Nicholas Baudin's *Atlas*. These comprise two portraits of First Tasmanians, and the map *Carte d'une Partie de la Côte Orientale de la Terre de Diémen*.

Exciting new projects are planned for 2018-2019.
