# Glamorgan Spring Bay Council Drought Weeds Grant 2020

## APPLICATION FORM

### Support for farmers to combat weeds during and after drought

Farmers in Glamorgan Spring Bay have access to support to manage weed issues related to drought, as part of the Tasmanian Government's Weed Action Fund Drought and Weed Management Program. A small grant program is currently open to assist farmers impacted by drought to undertake targeted weed management of species that limit agricultural production.

**Important dates and information**: Applications to be submitted to admin@freycinet.tas.gov.au or delivered to Glamorgan Spring Bay Council, 9 Melbourne St, Triabunna or posted to Glamorgan Spring Bay Council, PO Box 6, Triabunna 7190 by TO BE CONFIRMED. Applicants will be notified on the outcome by TO BE CONFIRMED. Projects must be completed by TO BE CONFIRMED.

- The grants will provide rebates for up to 66% of the total approved costs for a project (maximum of \$2500 ex GST rebate). There is \$30,000 available in total with expectations to support a minimum of 10 projects.
- If you are unsure if your project is eligible it is recommended you still apply, or contact the GSB NRM Works Coordinator. The Tasmanian Government's Weed Action Fund will be releasing further funding rounds in 2020/21.

Please read the Municipal Drought Weeds Grants 2020 - Guidelines and Eligibility, before filling out this form. It should be noted that meeting the eligibility criteria is not a guarantee of funding.

The completed applications, once received within timeline parameters, will be assessed and prioritised by the assessment panel. The panel's decision is final and no further correspondence shall be entered into.

The *Glamorgan Spring Bay Weed Management Plan 2015-2020* outlines criteria for determining weed management priorities in Glamorgan Spring Bay.
