
SWANSEA MAIN STREET REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT

etailed design on the Swansea Main Street upgrade continues, Council have now consulted with all properties in the impacted zone.

The image here shows treatment "of a kind", implying that something similar to these elements could exist in the indicated locations.

In general, the footpaths will be improved to allow for better pedestrian and disabled access. So far, feedback has been positive, with the exception of the second proposed "Loo with a view", In the community this has either strong support or strong opposition.

The construction commencement time frame



is preferred to be after Easter for traders, however there are grant timelines to meet as well, which may require the project to begin earlier in a staged approach to minimise disruption while meeting grant deed commitments.

COLES BAY FORESHORE PATH

his project has progressed to the detailed design stage. Directly impacted properties have been visited, and discussions with property owners have taken place. Briefings and feedback are ongoing with other stakeholders.



In the meantime, consultation for this project will continue to ensure that key stakeholders' views are heard and accommodated as far as practical.

MESSAGE FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER

Dear Residents and Ratepayers,

To enable informed discussion on the future budget and community levels of service, Councillors and senior staff will be pro-actively delivering background information on the financial sustainability of Council through several communication methods from now until the Council budget for 2022-2023 is established.

In summary this information will comprise of:

- Background information on asset renewal principles
- Council's asset backlog position and what that means for levels of service.
- The ratios that provide the picture of a Council's financial sustainability
- The targets for the respective ratios that are required to be achieved for sustainability
- Models of rate level increases and how over time these achieve the required ratios for sustainability

This will keep the community informed about future need for Council revenue and measures that Councillors must consider in order to achieve longterm financial sustainability.

- During bushfire risk conditions what to do and how early you'll leave

- Who to tell, where to go and several options for how to get there
- What to pack, ready to take with you
- How to prepare your animals
- How to get your property ready, whether you're choosing to leave early or staying to defend it
- About your back-up options for emergencies.

WORK EXPERIENCE STUDENTS

Glamorgan Spring Bay Council takes pleasure in supporting our local high school by hosting both year 9 and 10 students.

Depending on the student's goals, Council provides work experience in a variety of areas. Work experience allows students to gain hands-on experience in our organisation while also assisting individual students in making informed career decisions by assessing their aptitudes, interests, and exploring potential careers.





We recently had two Triabunna School students join Council for work experience who potentially are interested in working in the outdoor and indoor environment. Students were able to actively participate in the field by weed identification, using drone technology, and engaging in community tree planting alongside volunteers from the Orford Community Group, as well as collecting trash at the WTS Orford. Students were able to work closely in an administrative setting to get a sense of what administration is like in Local Government.







UPDATE ON THE ORFORD FORESHORE MASTER PLAN

ouncil and Parks and Wildlife Service have jointly engaged independent consultants, *Inspiring* Place working with North Barker Ecosystem Services, to develop a Master Plan for the Orford Foreshore. The area covered by the Plan is the public land surrounding the Prosser River estuary downstream to the Tasman Highway bridge and including the sandbags/training walls, Raspins Beach to the north and most of Orford Beach to the south.

The aim of this project is to prepare a Master Plan to assist land managers and the community to:

- Better understand, conserve and manage natural and cultural values, in particular the internationally recognised Important Bird Area (IBA);
- Improve community and visitor experience;
- Improve the provision of appropriate recreational facilities; and
- Enhance community connectivity between the Orford foreshore and the town centre.
- Progress to date has included:
- Preliminary consultation with Local and State

- Government stakeholders and local community groups; and
- A summary of the values. issues and options prior to preparation of a Draft Master Plan.

The next steps due to be completed in early 2022 are as follows:



- Release of the draft Master Plan for public review and feedback: and
- Preparation of an Issues Report and finalisation of the Master Plan for endorsement.

MARINE & BUILDINGS - SUMMARY OF RECENT WORKS

Buckland Hall

A new entrance is being constructed at the Buckland Community Hall funded by both the Local Roads Community Infrastructure (LRCI) phase 2 funding, and the Drought Communities round two funding. As well as new entrance stairs the Hall will have a compliant disability accessible ramp installed. A new entrance awning will be constructed as part of the project.



Gateway to Maria Island

The waiting area around the Gateway to Maria Island ferry terminal building has been upgraded. Along with new exposed aggregate concreting and garden edging, extra seating and a bike rack has been installed. This project was funded by the LRCI program phase 2. Parks and Wildlife have installed at their cost new power entry and exit doors.

Bicheno Boat Ramp

Planning has been approved for the proposed jetty extensions to the existing jetties at the Bicheno recreational boat ramp.
